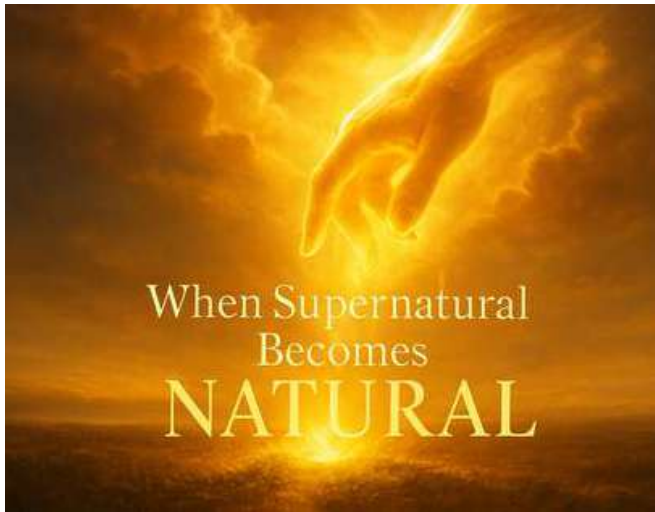

Making Miracles the Norm, not the Exception

The twelve disciples spent more than three years with Jesus. They witnessed firsthand what many prophets and righteous people before them had longed to see but never did. Before giving Himself up to be crucified, Jesus gathered His disciples and declared, "Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in Me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these" (John 14:12). The works of Jesus were unlike anything the world had ever seen - He raised the dead, walked on water, fed five thousand with five loaves of bread, and healed the blind, the deaf, and the crippled. Yet, He promised that those who believe in Him would do even greater works. If we are called to follow His words, then miracles should not be rare exceptions- they should become the norm.

The Gospel of Mark captures in chapter six both the hindrances and catalysts to living a life of miracles. The chapter opens on a sobering note – the inability of even Jesus to do many miracles. Mark was quick to identify the visible reason: a lack of people's faith (Mark 6:5-6). But beneath that surface, faith was merely the symptom.

The deeper cause was irreverence born out of familiarity. God has gifted us with a remarkable ability to adapt, yet that very adaptability can become our spiritual stumbling block. If we are not careful, we grow accustomed to the natural and in doing so, even Jesus is restrained from lifting us into the supernatural.

Having been rejected by His hometown, Jesus turned to His disciples and began to teach them what it truly takes to make miracles the norm rather than the exception. He prescribed a way of life that would normalize miracles, inviting ordinary people to walk in the extraordinary, to make the supernatural their natural. It began with three simple but profound mindsets.

1. Demotion

The first step is to believe and practice the absolute truth: you are not an owner, but a steward. In Psalm 24, David declared, “The earth is the Lord’s, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it.” Jesus painted this truth vividly showing that the steward depends entirely on the master for daily bread, carrying no bag, no money, and no reserve (Mark 6:8). A steward does not live to make money, but to manage what has been given to him by the master. He is fed not by wealth but by his master’s good pleasure. In this posture, every meal becomes a miracle, every provision a testimony of divine faithfulness. Worry, then, has no place in a steward’s life. Worry is to the spiritual body what cancerous cells are to the physical body - the less, the better. When we willingly take the demotion to stewardship and truly understand that we are not the owners of our body, family, business, job, or possessions, the worry about them disappears. And every provision becomes another miracle.

2. Duality

Jesus also instructed His disciples to “take your staff and sandals.” (Mark 6:8-9) Living in miracles does not mean sitting idly and expecting everything to be done for us. In those days, someone carrying a staff and wearing sandals symbolized an active person, one on a mission, constantly moving forward. The staff provided strength for long journeys and support on difficult terrain; the sandals represented readiness to walk wherever the Lord would lead. As Apostle Paul later wrote, “The one who is unwilling to work shall not eat.” (2 Thessalonians 3:10)

Living in the supernatural is a divine partnership, where we do our small part and God does the greater part. And that difference of the parts is what makes it a miracle.

3. Duty

Jesus was very specific when He said, “Whenever you enter a house, stay there until you leave that town.” (Mark 6: 10) If the goal had been merely to spread the good news, human reasoning would suggest: “The more homes you stay, the better the networking.” But Jesus’ instruction carried a deeper purpose - it was not only about the guest, but equally about the host. This was the host’s divine opportunity, chosen by God, to become the miracle for the traveler. And if the host embraced that calling, the opportunity would not be taken away. In His teachings, Jesus made it clear that our eternal inheritance will not be determined by how many sermons we preached or prayers we prayed, but by how we treated others—by how many we fed, clothed, and comforted in sickness or imprisonment (Matthew 25:35–36). Living in the Supernatural is not just about receiving miracles but also becoming one for someone else.

Jesus sent His disciples out with these instructions, and scripture tells us that they immediately began to do what He Himself had done—driving out demons and healing the sick. Jesus rejoiced and marveled that God had elevated them above the wisdom of the world, empowering them to make the supernatural their natural. I invite you to embrace these same words and put them into practice—so that in your life, miracles become the norm, not the exception.

Empowering Rural Nagaland for a Brighter Tomorrow



Nestled in the lush hills of Northeast India, Nagaland is home to a mosaic of vibrant tribal communities known for their rich traditions, craftsmanship, and deep connection to nature. Yet, beyond its scenic beauty lies a sobering reality—many of Nagaland's rural areas continue to grapple with poverty, inadequate infrastructure, and limited access to basic services.

In most villages, families rely heavily on subsistence agriculture, handloom weaving, and small-scale animal husbandry for survival. While these traditional livelihoods preserve cultural heritage, they often yield low and uncertain incomes. Seasonal crop failures, poor market access, and lack of modern agricultural inputs have made rural livelihoods increasingly fragile.



Educational opportunities in the interior villages remain limited. Many children still walk several kilometers to reach the nearest school, and shortages of qualified teachers and proper learning facilities hinder consistent learning outcomes. Although literacy rates in Nagaland are above the national average, the quality of rural education continues to lag, leaving a significant gap between urban and rural learners.

The living conditions in these areas reflect years of neglect—many homes lack clean drinking water, electricity, healthcare access, and proper sanitation. The younger generation, facing few job opportunities, often migrates to cities, leaving behind an aging rural population and further weakening local economies.

Urgent attention and targeted interventions are needed to uplift rural Nagaland. Investment in education, skill development,



and sustainable livelihood programs can empower communities to become self-reliant while preserving their cultural identity. Promoting eco-tourism, local crafts, and organic farming can create new income avenues without disturbing the delicate ecological balance of the region.

P R Baby Foundation intends to undertake a series of projects aimed at promoting sustainable livelihoods, improving educational access through micro schools, organizing farmers into Producer Groups (FPGs), and strengthening the branding and value addition of agricultural products.
