## Influencing Beyond Your Lifetime The Lessons from my Father

If given the choice, every person desires to leave a mark on this earth. An extreme example is the pyramids of Egypt, which are far more than giant stone structures. They embody a deep human longing: to create something that outlives one's own lifetime. For the pharaohs, the pyramids were attempts at immortality - not by living forever, but by being remembered forever. By constructing something massive, precise, and impossible to ignore, they ensured that thousands of years later people would still speak their names, study their culture, and marvel at their achievements.

When this desire is channeled correctly, it aligns with the purpose of God, and I firmly believe that if we desire so, the Lord will fulfill that purpose for you and me. For as Jesus said to Martha while she grieved the loss of her brother Lazarus: "The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die" (John 11:25-26). True to those words, the resurrection of Lazarus continues to be preached throughout the world even after thousands of years. After a lifetime of faithful service and mentorship, Paul closed his final letter, addressed personally to Timothy, with these words: "The Lord be with your spirit. Grace be with you *all*" (2 Timothy 4:22). Though the letter is written to one man, Paul ends it with a blessing to all. It is easy to imagine that Paul sensed, in his spirit,



that this letter would shape generations far beyond Timothy and far beyond Paul's own lifetime. In this same letter, Paul lays out seven metaphors, seven guiding principles that shaped his life and that he passed on to Timothy, and ultimately to us. It has now been three years since my father, the late Pastor P. R. Baby, went to be with the Lord, yet his influence in my life and in the lives of many others remains more relevant and alive than ever. He was my coach, my mentor, and my go-to advisor. Though he is no longer here physically, these seven metaphors that Paul taught and my father lived by have become the framework through which I continue to navigate my life and calling.

## 1. Father (2 Timothy 2:1-2)

Just as Paul mentored and poured himself into the lives of others, my father was a man of solutions, with a rare ability to blend practical wisdom with spiritual discernment. Whether advising fellow megachurch pastors, high-profile businessmen, government officials, or guiding the little children at Faithcity Church, he offered insight that was consistently clear, grounded, and, much to my amazement,

always right. His influence did not stem from a desire to impose his will, but from a deep longing to see every person around him flourish—spiritually, physically, and relationally. My father's heart was deeply moved whenever he saw someone in pain. He would do anything—take any risk, make any call, reach out to anyone - if it meant helping someone in need. He was truly a father to many.

## 2. Soldier (2 Timothy 2:3-4)

Soldiers never complain; they remain focused on obeying their commanding officer without hesitation or compromise. In spiritual matters, my father gave everything he had, offering the very best of his strength, focus, and devotion. Whether he was singing, worshiping, preaching, or praying, he did it with all his might—always at the top of his lungs and never anything less. He knew precisely who his commanding officer was, and because of that, he carried a boldness to speak truth plainly to any man or woman, without fear and without compromise.

## 3. Athlete (2 Timothy 2:5)

There are mandatory rules to every game, and violating them will disqualify an athlete.

My father was careful to obey the spiritual "rules." He embraced holiness, purity, and forgiveness of the heart. Yet he also understood the principle Jesus taught - that the Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. He led with compassion and empathy, resisting empty traditions and man-made restrictions so he could focus on what truly mattered: redeeming the soul.

## 4. Farmer (2 Timothy 2:6)

Paul wrote that the farmer should be the first to taste the fruit of his own crop. In the same way, my father never imposed on others what he did not practice himself. He was the same man in the church, in his secular job, and in our home. His boundaries were clear, consistent, and unwavering, no matter the setting in which he operated. I can say with conviction that he truly walked the talk.

## 5. Workman (2 Timothy 2:15)

Building a house and receiving a permit for that house are two different things. If someone builds with crooked boards, the permit will be denied, to their shame. My father built with straight boards. He built people's lives according to the "permit" of sound doctrine, unashamed.

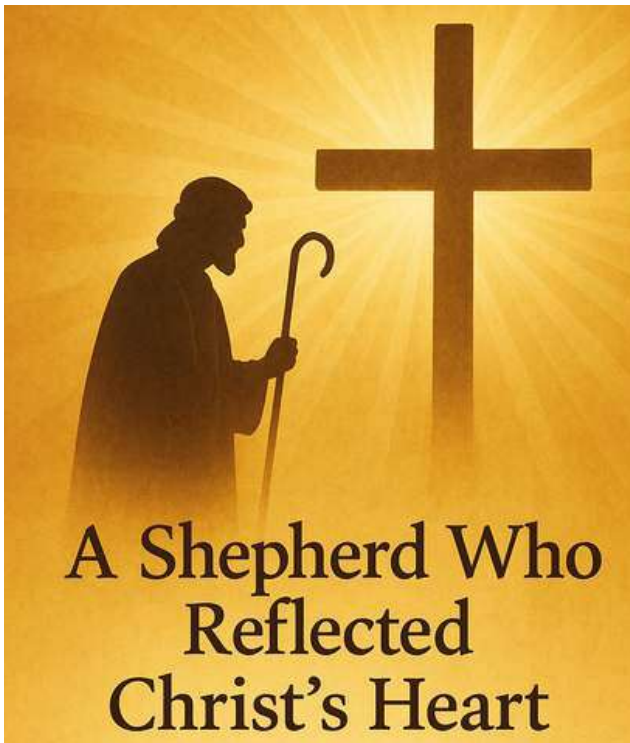

My first meeting with Pastor P R Baby was almost casual, although he had been a classmate of my younger brother, the late Dr. Tony, and a favourite student of my father, Prof. P. A. Daniel, at St. Albert's College. In those days, my wife, our foster son Gary (who had been unwell since birth), and I attended the deliverance meetings at AJ Hall regularly.

One evening, I decided to take Gary for a personal prayer. After the meeting, Pastor Baby and Sister Gracy spent time with each person who sought counselling or prayer. When Pastor heard my name, his affection for my father was clearly visible. The warmth, respect, and gratitude he expressed touched me deeply. That evening marked the beginning of a relationship that grew into something precious—between us, and with Sister Gracy as well.

### **A Ministry of Compassion and Personal Care**

In those days, I helped to coordinate the line of prayer seekers after the meetings. What amazed me was the personal attention Pastor Baby and Sister Gracy gave to each individual. Whether it was guidance, comfort, prayer, or just listening with love, they never hurried. Often the ministry extended late into the night—sometimes past 11:00 pm—yet they never showed tiredness when it came to serving God's people.

### **A Leader With Depth and Grace**

Pastor Baby was a man of remarkable memory and understanding, not only of the Scriptures, but in many areas of knowledge. His dedication, faith, and discipline were extraordinary. He carried an atmosphere of warmth that made people feel known, valued, and loved. He was a leader who walked with God, lived his faith with sincerity, and demonstrated Christlikeness through every interaction.

I can truly say: I have not seen another Christian quite like him.

As Scripture says:

“But you know Him, for He lives with you and will be in you.” (John 14:17)

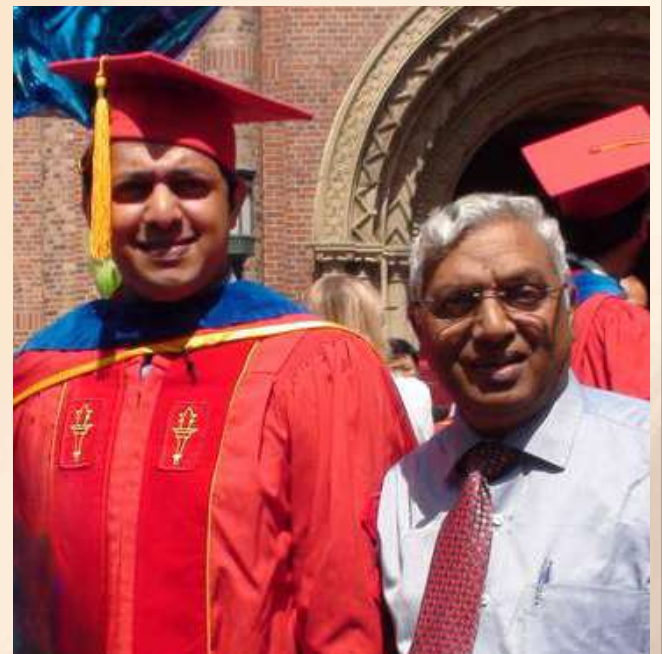
Christ lived in him — and he lived for Christ.

### A Passionate Shepherd

Pastor Baby’s passion for souls was unmatched. He would travel long distances and spend hours just to share the gospel with one person. For his monthly YMCA meetings at Kumbanad, he faithfully drove from Kochi, undeterred

by distance or fatigue. Whether preaching to ten or ten thousand, his zeal and diligence never changed. A visionary leader, he prayerfully planned every mission and carried it out with foresight and discernment.

Despite his spiritual stature, humility defined him. He encouraged others to grow, welcomed correction, and always kept a teachable heart. Compassion

### A Miraculous Beginning

My first encounter with him was at a convention in the COG Church, Othara, Kumbanad, in 2000. He began with a prophecy:

“Someone here seeks prayer for his ailing father with kidney failure. Lift your hand, and I will pray - God will heal him now.”

I raised my hand. My father was then in Pushpagiri Medical College for dialysis. The next morning, I was told he was completely healed - the doctors cancelled the dialysis.

That miracle convinced me Pastor Baby was truly anointed. That night, God spoke to me: “This is the man of God you were seeking - join him in ministry.” From then on, I attended his meetings faithfully, building a bond that continued until his final days. Today, I count it a privilege to continue that mission alongside Dr. Giby Raphael..

guided his every act—helping the needy freely, never seeking personal support, and trusting fully in God’s provision. He was also a loving husband and family man, never travelling without his wife, who stood faithfully by his side in every season of ministry.

### A Legacy of Faith

Pastor Baby lived what he preached - holy, disciplined, and uncompromising in faith. He fought the good fight and finished his course with honour.

Though some dreams - especially his mission for Meghalaya - remained unfulfilled in his lifetime, they were later realised by Dr. Giby Raphael and the Faithcity team, just as he had envisioned.

He travelled across India with a burning passion for souls, leaving behind no wealth or name for himself - only the enduring footprints of Christ for others to follow.

## A MENTOR WHO TRANSFORMED MY LIFE
